The responsibilities of the Fire Inspector / Investigator position include:

FIRE AND LIFE SAFETY INSPECTIONS:

Complete fire and life safety inspections of educational, industrial, multi-family, residential, institutional, mercantile, assembly, business, and hazardous occupancies within the Pike Township Fire Department service district for the purpose of determining compliance with Indiana's fire and building safety laws. Review new construction drawings to ensure compliance with applicable fire codes. Inspections focus on verifying compliance in the following areas, including, but not limited to:

- Means of egress (exiting) systems;
- Operational readiness and proper inspection, testing and maintenance of automatic fire sprinkler, fire alarm, kitchen hood and other alternative fire suppression systems;
- Operational readiness and proper inspection, testing and maintenance of standpipe systems and fire hydrants;
- Emergency preparedness, evacuation procedures, and fire drills;
- Proper storage and handling of hazardous materials and flammable/combustible liquids
- Fire department access
- Proper classification of occupancies
- Proper classification of construction type
- Occupant load calculations in assembly occupancies

FIRE AND LIFE SAFETY EDUCATION:

Schedule and present programs pertaining to fire safe behaviors, fire prevention measures, and life safety education, based upon behavioral objectives, including, but not limited to the following:

- Programs within schools, day cares, pre-schools, and senior citizen facilities.
- Assisting local businesses with fire safety education and evacuation planning.

FIRE INVESTIGATIONS:

Conduct fire scene examinations, when required by department policy, and in accordance
with nationally recognized standards, for the purpose of determining the fire's origin and
cause. This involves working in adverse weather conditions involving extreme hot or cold
conditions and environments that may be hazardous because of deteriorated structural
stability and/or materials burned. Included with the performance of fire investigation duties
is the ability to operate department photography equipment, conduct interviews, draw
diagrams/sketches, and write investigation reports that adequately document the fire
investigation.

RECORDKEEPING AND ADMINISTRATIVE PLANNING:

Document all fire and life safety inspections, fire investigations and other activities completed. Provide periodic reports of completed activities to the Fire Marshal for review. Assist in overall department planning through proposal of long-term plans and budget needs.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Twenty-one (21) years of age at the time of hiring
- High School Diploma or GED
- Valid Indiana Driver's License
- Have not been convicted of a felony
- Two (2) years of experience in one or more of the following: fire inspection, fire investigation, fire suppression, fire and life safety education, code enforcement, plans review, law enforcement AND at least one of the following on the date of hire:

Current certification as a State of Indiana IFSAC, ProBoard or ICC accredited Fire Inspector I/II or eligible for Indiana reciprocity OR ability to obtain certification within one (1) year of hire

Current certification as a State of Indiana IFSAC or ProBoard Fire Investigator, Certified Fire and Explosion Investigator (NAFI-CFEI), or Certified Fire Investigator (IAAI-CFI) OR ability to obtain one or more of these certifications within one (1) year of hire

Current certification as an IAAAI-FIT (Fire Investigation Technician OR ability to obtain certification within one (1) year of hire. NAFI Certified Fire and Explosion Investigator OR IAAI Certified Fire Investigator may substitute for this requirement.

Current ILEA Tier I or II certification as a Basic Police Officer or completion of a LETB approved full-time or reserve officer academy OR ability to obtain and maintain certification or appointment as a sworn Indiana law enforcement officer with the department-approved law enforcement agency within three (3) years from hire date.

- Ability to serve in an "on-call" capacity when required and able to respond to a fire scene within 30 minutes of notification. Must live in Marion county or a contiguous county within three (3) months of hire and maintain such residency during employment
- · Proficiency in Microsoft Office, Excel, PowerPoint, and Windows operating system
- Ability to bend, stand, climb stairs & ladders, and lift up to 50 pounds
- Ability to wear personal protective equipment in excess of 20 pounds

PREFERRED:

- Bachelor's degree in Fire Science or related field with two (2) years of fire service or law enforcement experience OR Associates degree in Fire Science with four (4) years of fire service or law enforcement experience
- Current certification as an Indiana State Fire Inspector I.
- Current certification as an Indiana State Fire Investigator, a NAFI Certified Fire and Explosion Investigator, or an IAAI Certified Fire Investigator.
